



About Us who we serve



Central San serves 488,900 customers

- Sewage collection and wastewater treatment; Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) disposal for 348,300 people. These services are provided over a 145-square-mile area.
- Wastewater treatment & HHW disposal for 140,600 people in Concord & Clayton by contract. These services are provided over a 30-square-mile area.
- HHW disposal only. These services are provided over a 9-square-mile area.
- Central San headquarters, treatment plant, HHW Facility and Residential Recycled Water Fill Station.
- Collection System Operations headquarters.






Central Contra Costa Sanitary District is a public utility that is dedicated to protecting the public health and the environment.


